What you will already know-

Mary Seacole-
Was born in Jamaica in 1805 and died in 1881 in London. She was a business woman who cared for British soldiers during the Crimean War.

What you will be know by the end of this unit-

Empire: You will have built on the understanding that not all groups in society are treated equally (Mary Seacole was a black woman). You will understand that Mary Seacole was born in the time where many black people were used as slaves.

Civilisation: You will understand that advances in British medicine drew Mary to England to train. You will know that she nursed many people who had diseases of the time, such as cholera and yellow fever. You will know that she started the British Hotel Hospital and understand how she did not discriminate against her patients. You will understand that Mary was key in helping others to train and progress.

Parliament: You will have a further understanding of the relationship between monarchy and parliament. You will understand that Jamaican rules and laws were set up and exercised in the same way as those in England.
